What should you do next?

Making a will should not be complicated but we recommend you do so with the advice of your solicitor or trustee.

There are three simple steps:

- Discuss your gift with your family and your solicitor or trustee.
- Ensure the wording is correct (see next page) and lodge your will or revised will with your solicitor or trustee.
- Once you have confirmed your will, write to us and let us know your intentions (see form on back page) so that you can be part of the Judy Gibson Society and we can acknowledge you accordingly.

The Schizophrenia Research Institute has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office as a deductible gift recipient and an income tax exempt charitable entity for tax purposes.

The wording of your bequest

It is important that your bequest is worded correctly and the following is recommended as a guide. You may wish to give this wording to the solicitor who is preparing your Will.

1. THE RESIDUE OF YOUR ESTATE

The residue is the amount left over after you have looked after your loved ones and outstanding debts.

"I give and bequeath to the Schizophrenia Research Institute, (ABN: 31 068 846 319), 405 Liverpool Street, Darlinghurst, NSW 2010, in aid of that institution and for its general purposes, the residue of my estate for which the receipt of the Treasurer or other authorised Officer shall be an absolute discharge."

2. A PERCENTAGE OF THE RESIDUE OF YOUR ESTATE

"I give and bequeath to the Schizophrenia Research Institute, (ABN: 31 068 846 319), 405 Liverpool Street, Darlinghurst, NSW 2010, in aid of that institution and for its general purposes, xx percent of the residue of my estate for which the receipt of the Treasurer or other authorised Officer shall be an absolute discharge."

3. A PERCENTAGE OF YOUR TOTAL ESTATE

If you have no dependent family, you may choose to give a percentage of your total estate.

"I give and bequeath to the Schizophrenia Research Institute, (ABN: 31 068 846 319), 405 Liverpool Street, Darlinghurst, NSW 2010, in aid of that institution and for its general purposes, xx percent of my total estate for which the receipt of the Treasurer or other authorised Officer shall be an absolute discharge."

Established in 1996 as Australia's first virtual medical research Institute, the Institute conducts and supports schizophrenia research in hospitals, universities and research institutes across the country and internationally. With over 60 employees and 140 scientific affiliates, the Institute drives a proactive research agenda, has invested over \$25 million and has had numerous successes to date.

In 2007, the Institute launched the Australian Schizophrenia Research Bank, the largest ever national brain research project in schizophrenia, which is collecting wide-ranging data on patients and controls for use in research programs.


